



Camper Rules

Your behavior will help make horse & pony camp a success. The following rules outline your responsibilities.

- Follow the policies, rules and requests of Eastern Iowa Horse & Pony Camp
- Attend all sessions and activities on time and in appropriate attire
- Treat other campers and adults with respect and attention
- Have a positive attitude!
- **MUST** wear a helmet and heeled boots at all times while mounted on your horse or pony
- Must carry insurance on themselves
- Check in all medication with the camp nurse at check in
- Wear your name tag at all times - a replacement name tag will cost \$3
- Will leave the dorm room, dining hall, barns, and camp grounds clean and neat
- Will not cause damage to public or private property - Camper will be charged for any damages.
- Will not engage in inappropriate conduct at camp
- The following is required for the horse/pony you are bringing to camp.
 - Health papers dated within 30 days of the camp by a licensed veterinarian.
 - Your horse/pony be up to date on the five-way, West Nile, and Rabies vaccinations.
 - A negative Coggins test for out of state horses.
 - Responsible for providing your own tack, hay, feed if needed, and bedding for your horse's stall
 - Bring only an **experienced and well broke** horse or pony to camp
 - No horses or ponies less than four years of age
 - No stallions, green broke horses, or mares with foals on their side
 - Must carry insurance on your horse and tack
- **Not** allowed to leave the fairgrounds without camp staff permission
- Not allowed to leave the dorm units after curfew without permission
- No eating or drinking in dorms
- Not allowed to switch stalls without permission
- **Items NOT ALLOWED at Camp**
 - Cell phones or any electronic devices
 - Knives, firearms, explosives, fireworks, or weapons of any kind
 - Tobacco (smoking or chewing), alcohol, or drugs
 - Money
 - Alarm clocks
 - Snacks or beverages
 - Hay bags
